Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ,

I hope you have had a great start to 2025 and have been seeing the Lord at work in your life as we pursue Him together as a church family this year!

The account of Naaman in 2nd Kings 5 is fascinating and God has revealed it in His word to transform our lives today. One theme in this account is that we need to trust God and speak up for Him. Naaman was the captain of the army of the king of Aram. Aram is situated in modern day Syria and they were enemies of the people of Israel. Naaman was an accomplished warrior and leader but Naaman had a big problem. He was a leper and he needed to be healed!

We are told that Naaman had a little slave girl who had been taken captive from Israel and she served his wife. Imagine this girl's life...she was taken captive, likely her home had been destroyed and likely many if not all of her family members had been killed and possibly, she was a witness to that. And now, she has to serve the people who were responsible! Talk about a hard knock life! Amazingly, she speaks up to her mistress about a solution to Naaman's leprosy. She says there is a prophet in Israel who can cure him (v.4). Rather than soaking in bitterness and anger and wanting the worst for her captor, she chooses to speak up and point him to his healing. We do not know what went on in her heart and perhaps the tension she felt there, but what we see is that she chose to continue to trust in God and speak up about God's power to heal her enemy. **Do we trust God and His power to heal in Christ? Do we speak up?**

The story moves forward and Naaman responds to her slave girl's words and goes to Israel seeking this prophet. Naaman's persistent search leads him to the house of Elisha the prophet of the Lord. At this point, Elisha does not come out to greet his great captain, but instead sends his servant to tell Naaman to simply, "go and wash in the Jordan seven times, and your flesh will be restored to you and you will be clean." (v.10) Naaman rather than simply doing this completely goes bonkers and storms off in a rage of anger. Why? His pride! His position as a great captain! His national pride! His expectations of what God should do. All of these get in the way of his healing. You see, Naaman was willing to be healed as long as God's way was Naaman's way. Naaman expected the prophet to come out to him and call on the Lord and heal him on the spot. But to go to those dirty waters of the Jordan and wash...that was beneath him and his dignity. "I deserve better treatment!!" So, he storms off...do we do this? Do we tell God that as long as He is going my way, I will follow Him, but then, storm off when His way is different? Or perhaps just calmly persisting and going in our way rather than trust Him?

But again, his servants came near and spoke to him saying, "My father, if the prophet had told you to do some great thing, would you not have done it? How much more, then, when he tells you, 'Wash and be cleansed'!" (v.13) Naaman is blessed to have good servants around him! They speak up and Naaman, probably realizing again how desperate his leprosy is and knowing his imminent need for healing, humbles himself and goes and washes and he is healed. As the story finishes, Naaman returns to Elisha humbled and healed and we discover that God has healed his heart too as Naaman commits his life to the Lord (see v.15-19).

Like the little slave girl and Naaman's servants...WE NEED TO SPEAK UP! There are people in our lives and sphere of influence who need the healing that only comes from Christ. Jesus is God's only way to eternal healing. Those we talk to about Him may storm off or be stubborn on the surface, but deep down they are desperate for healing. Keep praying for them and do not give up! Speak up and share the gospel and do not give up! The Lord can and does change hearts and lead people to Himself for He is the Great Physician! Will we speak up? Let us pray and speak up confidently in Him, one life at a time!
